We helped him work through some barriers and opened the door to his personal interests. He was excited to learn about the film club. We let him know this year would be a new chapter and a fresh start and that he can grow into the person he wants to be. So far, we have seen his absenteeism rate drop by 12% this school year and he has formed a new group of friends from film club! Creating a growth mindset and helping students with their internal narratives can be powerful, especially when they feel a sense of belonging and support"
